Section 9: Exposure Monitoring Records

In rare instances, it may be necessary to perform personnel exposure monitoring when working with a hazardous chemical. This can occur when chemical exposure levels approach or exceed the Permissible Exposure Limit (PEL) of OSHA and the Threshold Limit Value (TLV) of ACGIH (see <u>Section 4.2, Section 5.3</u>, and <u>Appendix B</u> of the UTK CHP for details). Initial monitoring is required if there is reason to believe that the action level (or PEL if there is no applicable action level) for a substance is routinely exceeded. If the initial monitoring discloses employee exposure over the action level or PEL an exposure monitoring program may be initiated. Employees must be notified of the results within 15 working days after the receipt of the results by posting in an accessible location.
